| Jacques Cartier room | In recent years, universities have seen increased political, public and media scrutiny regarding freedom of expression, respectful discourse and safety on campus, especially in the light of recent geopolitical events, as well as the targeting of academia in a time of polarized discourse that aims to position universities at the centre of social and cultural shifts. In some jurisdictions, provincial governments have required universities to adhere to the Chicago Principles, which are grounded in US, rather than Canadian jurisprudence and context. This session is an opportunity for members to learn about initiatives happening on campuses across the country and to consider the merit of a Canadian set of principles on freedom of expression, whether there is value in developing something sector-wide or advance institutional principles based on best practices and individual contexts. |
