Enhance Canada's immigration system to reclaim leadership in education and talent

Canada's immigration system is often a first point of contact and gives a critical first impression of the country for investors, business partners, tourists, visitors and international students. It should reflect Canada's excellence and innovation, high quality of government services, high standard of living and technological advancement. Instead, our immigration system suffers from technical issues and inefficiencies, resulting in complex and delayed application processes.

What needs to be done

The Digital Platform Modernization (DPM) program—with a budget of \$800 million and slated for completion by 2026 aims to ensure every individual's first interaction with Canada is smooth and positive.

The completed DPM will enhance data sharing, support sound policy-making and boost public confidence by aligning immigration policies with economic and talent needs.
